


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### **DO YOU KNOW**

Dr. B.R. Ambedkar popularly known as Dr. Babasaheb Bhimrao Ramji Ambedkar, the father & the chief architect of Indian constitution was a multifaceted personality.

He was a an intellectual, a philosopher, a patriot, a social reformer, a champion of dalits, a scholar, a writer, constitution maker, an economist, an eminent lawyer and a feminist.



Catalytic development of the online teaching need and solutions

Since lockdown started from last week of March 2020, teachers initially started online classes by creating WhatsApp group and did practice teaching in which rudimentary concepts were taught. After a week or so new syllabus started to be taught and most of the teachers were themselves able to use - Voice chat for interaction, Text chat for Instructional exchange, Google form and Survey monkey-based home work and assignments. In a few days all other teachers picked up the methods and started teaching without any difficulty.

During summer vacation tenure various Online Conferences were organized by the school for the teachers and also organized by CBSE and Publishers to ensure that teachers use standard methods of online teaching. During this vacation time, teachers prepared their online content and equipped themselves with white boards, pen tablets, Mobile Camera etc in the best possible manner. Further online classes again resumed in its full swing from May 18, 2020 in which teachers are now acting as proficient online tutors and there is no technical challenge Infront of them.

The rate of crime has increased day by day and this type of natural disaster like COVID-19 assists crime to emerge in society not just to fulfill greediness but sometimes by exigent. The shortage of hospitals, oxygen cylinder, woods for funerals or for cremation, impelled society to sob. Society started exploring for new opportunities for livelihood some of them are on the tactic path and some are not.

When we take fresh air, the idea or positivity automatically comes to our mind but when the circumstances are not in our control, we feel compelled and the situations bound us to do something which is morally incorrect.

Creative minds are the most delicate part of society. Creativity should be used in a positive manner otherwise it can erect disaster for everyone there is a say that a sword needs its cover same sharp mind need the right path otherwise. They will endanger unhackneyed hurdles instead of forge for society, as in the case of COVID -19 there is the emergence of advance crime during this period which accelerates Cyber Crime, Banking fraud whereas it also decreases the cases of traditional crime by 200,000 cases.

"We have tracked 200 cases where traffickers were operating in the grab of spas and massage parlors in 2020 and 2021".

#### **IMPORTANT BANKING TERMS**



**RTGS vs NEFT** 

In NEFT, settlement of all transaction requests takes place at a particular "cut-off time", according to the RBI. On the other hand, in RTGS, the transactions are settled individually. In NEFT, for example, any transaction initiated after a designated settlement time would have to wait till the next designated settlement time. However, in RTGS, the transactions are processed continuously throughout the stipulated business hours.

Both NEFT and RTGS are maintained by the RBI.

#### IMPS

#### (Immediate Payment Service)

IMPS is a payment service managed by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI). This service enables individuals to make money transfer instantly through banks and RBI-authorized Prepaid Payment Instrument Issuers (PPI) across the country. Unlike NEFT and RTGS, IMPS is available round the clock throughout the year, even on bank holidays. Currently, there are 53 commercial banks and 101 rural, district, urban and cooperative banks that support the IMPS service, according to the NPCI website. An IMPS transaction can be initiated from a mobile phone, through internet or an ATM, wherein confirmation of debit or credit is sent by an SMS.








All the girls danced gracefully & they have given meaning to every word with their art. The energetic Cinematic dance by B. Tech boys couldn't stop anyone from dancing.

An Art Gallery is a platform that helps to highlight our students' creative ambition and drive and to give them a chance to showcase their hard work and inspiration.


